What is the Young Mayors program?



The Young Mayors program supports young people aged 13 to 17 across Cairns to run for election and form a brand new Cairns Youth Council of 12 members. Elected by their peers, together this Youth Council will set an agenda for their 18 month Term in Office and work with the Cairns Regional Council on specific issues.

With access to training, mentoring and money to run local projects and campaigns, the Youth Council don't just have a voice - but a platform to take action on the issues that young people in Cairns truly care about.

It's <u>free</u> for all young people to apply and participate in Young Mayors.

Who runs the Young Mayors program?

Young Mayors is a pilot program run by the Foundation for Young Australians (FYA), in partnership with Cairns Regional Council and other councils around Australia. Young Mayors is supported by the Electoral Commission of Queensland. FYA is a national non-profit organisation that exists to back young people across the country to beat injustice and create long-lasting change for all.

What you can expect if you're elected to the Youth Council

Representing your community on the Cairns Youth Council is an important responsibility. It will also be a whole lot of fun. If you're elected, you will:

- Participate in a 2 day induction, held in October 2025
- Participate in workshops and consultations during October April to establish a Priority Agenda
- Serve a 18 month Term in Office, from 1 February 2026 to 30 June 2027
- Participate in regular meetings. Meetings are held in-person (support to access online meetings provided). For more information about Youth Council meetings, check out the Young Mayors FAQ pack.
- Work with the other members of the Youth Council to select a Youth Council Mayor, Deputy Mayor - Spokesperson and Deputy Mayor -Secretary.
- Together with other members of the Youth Council, develop a priority agenda and get involved in activities led by the Youth Council in the community, as well as contribute towards Cairns Regional Council projects and planning
- Represent your community and celebrate its diversity; share opinions and ideas, learn from others and contribute to creating a better future for your region.

The Youth Council is non-partisan and not affiliated with any political party or ideology. If you're a member of a political party, aligned with a political representative or subscribe to the views of a specific ideology, we'll ask you to not represent any party and participate as an independent candidate.

If you're <u>selected as a candidate</u> to run for election, you'll get access to:

- Online and in-person workshops to prepare you for campaigning
- A small budget for campaign materials and 10 t-shirts for you and your supporters to promote your campaign
- The opportunity to speak to your constituents through a 'Meet the Candidates' community forum (with support to prepare)
- Coaching and well-being support from the Young Mayors Program team throughout your campaign



If you're <u>elected to the Youth Council</u> you'll get access to:

- The chance to connect and collaborate with young people on Youth Councils in other parts of the country.

Who can apply?

Keen to nominate? Excellent choice.

Nominees must meet the following criteria:

- live in the Cairns Regional Council local government area
- aged between 13 and 17 years at the time of nomination
- be able to commit to attending induction days and meetings
- submit your own nomination

We encourage young people with a diversity of lived experience of life in Cairns to nominate, including First Nations people, LGBTQIA+ people, disabled people / people with disability, women and non-binary people, young people from low-income households, people from diverse cultural backgrounds and people of colour.

You do not need to be an Australian citizen to nominate yourself.

What is the nomination process?

To nominate, all you need to do is read and fill out this form: fya.org.au/CairnsNominations

After nominations close, your application will be assessed by a panel of FYA, Cairns Regional Council team members and a young representative from the community. Not everyone who applies will be selected as a candidate to run for election. Candidates will be selected based on their application and availability to commit to the Term in Office.

If you're not selected, we will provide feedback to help you develop a stronger application if you want to apply again in future years.

Note: You are campaigning to be a youth councillor. Once elected, the Youth Council will elect a Mayor and Deputies.
